HORWITZ MEMORIAL COMPETITION FOR VIOLIN & PIANO DUO DEADLINE NOV 16

The fourth annual David R. Horwitz Memorial Competition for Violin and Piano Due will take place on Sunday, December 16, 2007, at the Academy of Music in Gaithersburg, MD. Enclosed is an application form. Forms may also be obtained by contacting Claudette Horwitz at *chorwitz@starpower.net* or Judith Silverman at *s.judith@verizon.net*. Please mail applications to reach the chair by November 16, 2007.

This competition features music written for violin and piano duo, to be performed by high school students, grades 9 through 12. Two compositions are required with a minimum playing time of 5 minutes and maximum time of 15 minutes. Both pieces may be sonata or sonatina movements in contrasting styles or periods, or you may select one sonata/sonatina movement and one piece for violin with piano accompaniment.

Only one teacher needs to be a member of the MSMTA in order to enter two students.

The three finalists will receive cash prizes: \$100 for First Place, \$75 for Second Place, and \$50 for Third Place.

THANK YOU TO THEORY TEACHERS

Please excuse the alliteration, but there's no other way to say a very big "Thank You" to all the teachers who sent in theory program registration forms. After 15 years of inputting the names and levels of thousands of students prepared to take part in the MSMTA Theory Testing Program, this year's process was by far the easiest. Nearly all the names were very clearly printed, which cut down significantly on the need to call the teacher and ask for clarification, as in the past. All the checks were correctly calculated, and properly made out to MSMTA. Email addresses were provided, which helped the chairs cut down on phone calls to teachers.

The only requests I would make for future years are these: Teachers should list students FIRST BY LEVEL, then BY LAST NAME, as stated on the form. Do not list students alphabetically first.

If a student is taking two levels, the name should be included separately in each level's numerical list.

If you are entering in more than one center, please stick a Post-It note on the front page to alert me to that fact.

To cut down on paper usage, fill up each page with names and levels, in numerical order. Please DO NOT use a different sheet for each level.

Again, many thanks for helping to make a time-consuming and detailed task much more manageable.

Application: Send a separate entry form for each test location

Eligibility: Any student of an MSMTA member, including adults may participate. There are no age or grade restrictions for any level of the exam. The Level 2 test requires 2nd grade reading comprehension. High school students who are candidates for the DMA Award must be tested at no less than Level 3 and at a higher level each year thereafter. Effective in 1997-1998, two levels per year may be entered and both levels will count towards Junior/Senior DMA and/or Theory Awards. Teachers entering students must be prepared to assist with the event. If unable to work, the individual teacher is responsible for finding a qualified MSMTA member as a substitute.

Please note: Two new guidelines have been adopted by the theory committee.

- 1. Students may only be transferred one time.
- 2. Once registered students may not be transferred to an earlier center. (i.e. Students may not be registered for an April Center and then transferred to a March Center) Names of transfer students must be e-mailed to Deborah White-Bondhus no later than the Sunday prior to the transfer center.


