We look forward to a new Theory syllabus in the fall and I will be sending everyone more information about that in the near future.



Musician—Heal Thyself! Developing and Maintaining Healthy Practice Habits

Remaining healthy throughout our entire lives is something to which we all should strive, not only as musicians but as human beings. But far too often, we musicians develop injuries from doing the thing we love the most—playing our instrument. In this session, Jim will discuss things we can all do to stay healthy while practicing our instrument. Basic elements such as learning how to sit or stand properly, and breathe properly, can have an enormous impact on our physical comfort while practicing. And the "elephant in the room" regarding wellness as musicians is quite often unnecessary tension. In this session, we'll learn how to address problems of unnecessary tension, enabling us to have a lifetime of healthy music making.

Conference Presenters

James Litzelman, NCTM



James Litzelman, NCTM, enjoys a successful career as a pianist, teacher and lecturer, having performed and lectured in the United States, Mexico, Europe, China and Russia. In demand for master classes, adjudicating and workshops, he presents lectures nationally and internationally to music organizations and has judged competitions throughout the eastern and southern United States.

Dr. Litzelman's path in the musical world has not been a traditional one. He grew up on a farm in central Illinois and didn't begin to study piano until the age of 16, where his first piano teacher was Sandra Clark Nichols. He attended

Eastern Illinois University as a student of Catherine A. Smith. Near the end of his doctoral studies in piano performance at the Catholic University of America he was diagnosed with focal dystonia, a neuromuscular disorder that afflicts classical pianists and guitarists in a disproportionate number. He began to research the causes of this condition, and through retraining and physical therapy with a gifted Rolfer, Dr. Litzelman has regained his capability at the instrument.

As a result of his dystonia diagnosis Dr. Litzelman has become a passionate advocate for pianistic health, regularly lecturing on healthful piano technique at music conferences and symposiums. He has spent the last 20 years seriously investigating piano technique and how one may play the piano in the most physiologically correct way. This work has been of enormous benefit to his students, with many pianists seeking his insight because of their own or their students' problems.

James Litzelman, NCTM (cont'd)

Dr. Litzelman has presented collaborative concerts and master classes in Shenyang, China, and has performed solo and collaborative recitals at the Rachmaninoff Hall of the Moscow Conservatory and Sviatoslav Richter Museum in Moscow, Russia. In March 2012 he was a judge for the national finals of the MTNA piano competitions in New York City, and this past March he judged the Canadian Music Teachers Association National Piano Competition. He has served on the faculty of the George Washington University Piano Academy in July 2012 for its summer program and has presented at the Washington International Piano Festival. He is heavily involved with regional music organizations and served as president of the Northern Virginia Music Teachers Association from 2009-2011. Dr. Litzelman is a published writer with numerous articles appearing in musical journals such as *Keyboard Companion* and the *American Music Teacher*. Dr. Litzelman currently serves as chairman of the editorial committee of the *American Music Teacher* magazine, the official journal of the Music Teachers National Association, is a reviewer of new books and music for that periodical, and is a nationally certified music teacher.

Since 1993, Dr. Litzelman has been a member of the piano faculty at The Catholic University of America in Washington, DC. He teaches applied piano and courses in piano pedagogy and musicians' wellness, and directed the graduate piano pedagogy program at CUA from 2000-2010. Litzelman was invited to teach a course in piano pedagogy at the University of Maryland, College Park, in the fall of 2016. Litzelman frequently lectures on piano technique and musicians' wellness at local, state and national levels, most recently presenting at the 2018 MTNA national conference on pianists with focal dystonia who have returned to playing. Dr. Litzelman is particularly interested in teaching young people and he maintains an active independent studio at his home in Arlington, Virginia, where his students have been prize winners in many local and national competitions.

Nancy O'Neill Breth



Nancy O'Neill Breth teaches piano in Washington DC. As a faculty member of Washington's Levine School of Music for 25 years, she taught chamber music, piano, and pedagogy and led Levine's chamber music program. Earlier, while living in the Philippines, Mexico City, and New York City, she was founder and pianist of chamber ensembles that performed to critical acclaim.

Since retiring from the concert stage, Nancy has become more and more devoted to teaching. She has acquired special expertise in the preparation and performance of piano duets. Three teams from the Breth Studio have won the Music Teachers National Association Senior Piano Duet competition. And she was invited three times, most recently in 2017, to judge the national finals of MTNA's Senior Piano Duet competition. Nancy has also served for many years on the faculty of the Kinhaven Adult Piano Workshop in Weston, Vermont, an annual event featuring music for piano four hands.

Breth students have been winners or finalists in local, national and international piano and chamber music competitions including MTNA, Fischoff National Chamber Music Competition, Pepsico National Young Artists Competition, International Institute for Young Musicians, National Symphony Orchestra Young Soloists, Eastman International Piano Competition.

A pianist and three chamber groups from the Breth studio were featured on National Public Radio's "From the Top". In 2015, her student was gold medalist of the Eastman International Piano Competition and made his New York City debut as part of his prize.

In April, 2017, another Breth student, at the invitation of the composer, premiered *Azeri Rhapsody: Mugam* by Alexander Peskanov in Weill Recital Hall of Carnegie Hall in New York City.

Nancy's major piano teachers were Margaret Saunders Ott, Gyorgy Sebok, and Carroll Chilton. Joseph Gingold, Janos Starker and Rudolf Kolisch coached her in chamber music. Her performance degrees are from Indiana University and the University of Wisconsin.

Nancy has presented at two MTNA national conferences (Seattle and New York), as well as at state and regional conferences in Oregon, Montana, Virginia, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts and Colorado. She received an Outstanding Teacher award from Florida State University, where she gave a master class and a presentation on practicing to the piano and pedagogy faculty. Nancy grew up in Spokane, Washington, and one of her most cherished professional experiences has been to return to Spokane four times as piano adjudicator in the prestigious, week-long Musicfest Northwest.

Nancy has written for Clavier, American Music Teacher and Clavier Explorer. Her publications include *Practicing the Piano; The Piano Student's Guide to Effective Practicing;* and *Parent's Guide to Effective Practicing.* All are published by Hal Leonard Corp.



MSMTA GAIL F. MCDONALD HIGH SCHOOL PIANO EXAMINATIONS

The High School Piano Examinations Program is a unique example of how schools and professionals in the community work together to enhance students' educational options. Done in cooperation with the Maryland State Department of Education, this is the 38th year that this program has provided recognition, and in some cases credit, to piano students in their high school. Ann Matteson as the first chair, worked under the leadership of MSMTA president, Dr. Gail F, McDonald. Others who worked in the program at the origination were: Mary Jane Schaeffer, Gary Dinn, Dr. Stewart Gordon, and Ruth Weinberg. Working with the legislature and the Maryland State Department of Education's Director, Division of Instruction, Dr. James W. Lathan and Mr. James L. Tucker, Jr., Chief, Aesthetic and Gifted Programs. The examinations are unique in that they are open not only to MSMTA teachers' students, but to any Maryland student in grades 9 through 12 who study piano privately. Letters and applications forms to out each fall to the principals and to music department heads of all public and private high schools in Maryland to tell them about the program. Students play a minimum of 10 minutes of memorized music from three different periods of music literature. They receive critiques from two judges, a certificate of achievement, and a report to be placed in their permanent record folder.

Students taking the examination for credit, must present 5 more minutes of adjudication time in technique over and above the memorized music.

This year we had 172 students take the examination for recognition plus 4 students for credit. We are pleased to see this valuable program continue for the benefit of the students.

MSMTA THEORY 2019

MSMTA will be adopting the Royal Conservatory of Music Theory Syllabus, 2016 edition, starting with the 2019 exam. The written portion of the exam will draw from material in the Celebrate Theory books. The RCM syllabus is readily available online:

https://www.rcmusic.com/sites/default/files/files/S44_TheorySyl_2016_ONLINE_RCM_V2_F.PDF

There are workbooks, teacher answer keys, and practice examinations available. These may prove invaluable in preparing your students for the theory exam. The theory books may be purchased directly from the RCM website. Currently, you can special-order the books locally from Music & Arts stores. If you order on "Teacher Appreciation Day", you can take advantage of their 30 percent discount for teachers. I have spoken with one of the managers at Music & Arts about carrying the series in the stores. Currently, Music & arts is running a special where teachers get 30 percent discount for in-stock items every day. Hopefully, the *Celebrate Theory* books will be on the shelves soon. The format of the questions of the written portion of the MSMTA exam will be the same as RCM.

The RCM theory syllabus does not include ear training. The theory committee will be working this summer to draft the ear training requirements for each level and will post them in the members-only section of the MSMTA website as soon as they are ready. We also plan to post ear training examples for each level as you will not be able to purchase sample tests this year since it will be the inaugural year of the new exam.

In order to facilitate a smoother transition to the new syllabus, the students will automatically get 5 points added to their score in 2019. However, the maximum score a student can receive will still be 105.

The RCM system labels their levels differently from what MSMTA has been doing in theory. To avoid confusion about what level materials to use, MSMTA will largely adopt the RCM levels. There will still be 12 levels but it will range from Prep through 11. MSMTA Levels 9-11 will draw from material in the RCM Level 9 Harmony book and specific requirements will be posted on the MSMTA website this summer.

For 2019, exams will be labeled as the level plus the letter A to distinguish between old and new levels:

Because we are moving to a new system, students will be permitted to repeat the highest level they took in 2018 and both can count toward awards. Therefore, just for 2019, theory honors may be earned after taking the following levels if all the other requirements have been met:

For the 2019 exam, there will be no level 11 given.

This also means that a student can repeat their highest level from last year and both will count toward DMA points. For example, a student that took level 4 in 2018 can take 3A in 2019, 4B in 2020, and use points from all for the DMA until we catch up with the new numbering system.

While there may be some confusion regarding levels at first, the theory committee feels this will be a positive step for our MSMTA students and strongly recommends that teachers use the RCM workbooks to assist in preparing for the 2019 MSMTA theory exam.





In 2017-18, we have held the following six wonderful student recitals: October 14, 2017, chaired by Sima Elkis with 32 performers from 5 studios; November 12, chaired by Alla Merport with 84 performers from 7 studios; February 11, 2018, chaired by Olga Kuperstein with 78 performers from 5 studios; April 28 with 14 performers from 2 studios, May 6 with 24 performers from 4 studios, and May 13 with 44 performers from 5 studios, all chaired by Christopher Hall. We have administered over 150 Keyboard Musicianship tests on September 30, 2017, chaired by Olga Kuperstein, and October 15, chaired by Christopher Hall.
