

## **Remembering Claudette**

Claudette Horwitz joined Maryland State Music Teachers Association some thirty-seven years ago and made a significant contribution to this organization. At the same time, she was also a piano teacher who, over the years, taught thousands of students at her studio in Rockville, MD. She was very dedicated to MSMTA and held most every office at some time in her career, even coming back on the board and remaining as treasurer for many years after her four year presidency. Her work with



the theory program coincided with all of her roles on the board so it made her a very busy person. The Keyboard Musicianship Program was expanded and MSMTA welcomed the newest local association--Greater Columbia MTA--during her presidency (1989-1993). One can't even imagine the number of hours that Claudette contributed to MSMTA over this long period of time.

Claudette was professional and businesslike but she could be flexible in her dealings with the thousands of people that she dealt with. She was kind and considerate and kept all students foremost in her mind. With the Student Activities Committee, she established the Leveque Violin Competition in memory of her brother which was held for several years. Then during her presidency, with the help of the Student Activities Committee, she conceived of the Distinguished Music Award. At the time this was just for high school students and Claudette saw it as a way of honoring students who distinguished themselves by participating in a large variety of MSMTA events. It became very popular and did encourage students to perform and develop their skills in many MSMTA programs. Because of its success, Claudette saw it as a way to also honor junior high students and some years later she was even instrumental in establishing the Elementary DMA.

MSMTA feels honored to have had Claudette as one of its distinguished members and knows that it is a better organization because of the significant part she played in its history.

## MSMTA Gail F. McDonald High School Piano Examination 2022

#### Recognition/Credit for Private Piano Study

#### Deborah White-Bondhus, Chair

The High School Piano Examinations Program is a unique example of how schools and professionals in the community work together to enhance students' educational options. Done in cooperation with the Maryland State Department of Education, this is the 42nd year that this program has provided recognition, and in some cases credit, to piano students in their high school. Ann Matteson, as the first chair, worked under the leadership of MSMTA president, Dr. Gail F. McDonald. Others who worked in the program at its origin was: Mary Jane Schaeffer, Gary Dinn, Dr. Stewart Gordon, and Ruth Weinberg. Working with the legislature and the Maryland State Department of Education's Director, Division of Instruction, Dr. James W. Lathan and Mr. James L. Tucker, Jr., Chief, Aesthetic and Gifted Programs. The examinations are unique in that they are open not only to MSMTA teachers' students, but to any Maryland student in grades 9 through 12 who study piano privately. Letters and application forms go out each fall to the principals and to music department heads of all public and private high schools in Maryland to tell them about the program. Students play a minimum of 10 minutes of memorized music from three different periods of music literature. They receive critiques from two judges, a certificate of achievement, and a report to be placed in their permanent record folder.

This year we had 135 students take the examination for recognition. We are pleased to see this valuable program continue for the benefit of the students.

Deborah White-Bondhus Chair, MSMTA High School Piano Examinations

During the 2nd half of the school year, MTAB presented the Classical Competition on Saturday, February 26, with 40 entries and six ensemble groups. This event was chaired by Katya Merchant and judged by Dr. Christine



Kim. The place winners received monetary award and certificates, and the 1st place winners, plus "the best Classical piece" winners from the younger two levels received their monetary award and certificate after they performed at the General Meeting on Wednesday, March 2 at Village Baptist Church in Bowie. There were 75 entries for the MSMTA Keyboard Musicianship Exam on Saturday, March 26, conducted by the teachers, either virtually or in-person. Currently, there is no physical Bowie center. Our annual Senior Awards competition had four entrants, was held on Saturday, April 30, and was judged by Stephen Gibson (a former member who is now on the faculty at Howard University.) The senior performance was held the previous Wednesday, April 27, preceding the last General Meeting, and at that time, the students received their framed certificates and spoke about their future plans (two of the four are majoring in music, one in piano and the other in voice!) and the money prizes were awarded after the April 30 competition. All the students performed very well at the competition, and so we have decided to have the senior performance precede, rather than follow, the actual competition, thereby giving the students the opportunity to perform their pieces on the piano ahead of the competition!

MTAB's last student event was the May 14 VIRTUAL Piano Evaluation, administered and judged by Owen Adams, MTAB's member and technical adviser. The annual Board "Planning" Meeting was held on Wednesday, June 8 at the home of President Jeannine Case, and was followed by a delicious lunch prepared by the attending members. 

We followed up the digging deeper class in a session where colleagues shared how they teach scales and stressed the importance of scales as the foundation of learning music. A few members were able to attend the State Conference in November where we could learn about the commonalities of Athletes and Musicians, African Diaspora Music, Collaborative piano, and Real Kids. We appreciate the efforts of the conference committee. We had a small gathering of members in December and we learned some Christmas music trivia.

We know there are many different kinds of learners. Member Nick IntVeldt, led our Improv. 102 Lecture and Lab in February, which is a great resource to use with students who learn better in this setting. The hands-on lab was a great tool to help us better understand and guide beginning improvisation. A few members had students participate in the MSMTA Keyboard Musicianship Testing.
