Keyboard Musicianship

Thank you to all the local chairs, teachers and students who participated in the Keyboard Musicianship Program this year!

In 2023-2024, **all local centers will be in-person** at a local venue and judged by an adjudicator who is not the student's teacher. It is time to get back to what used to be "normal life!" The wearing of masks at the events will be up to the venue and local chair to work out. This summer the 2020 Keyboard Syllabus will be updated with corrections and layout changes. Check the MSMTA website under "Members only" in mid-August for the updated version. If you have made notes in your current version, you can continue to use it. Your local chair will be notified when it is available.

One important rule change will apply for Awards starting next year: Requirements for Keyboard Awards to be amended as follows: For a student to earn the Intermediate Honors, High Honors, Advanced Honors, or Distinguished Honors Awards, modules cannot be more than two levels below the scales/arpeggios module. For example, a student testing in Level 12 scales/arpeggios can test at Level 10 or 11 in the other modules, but not lower.

Gail F. McDonald High School Piano Examinations

Recognition and Credit for Private Music Study, 2023

The High School Piano Examinations Program is a unique example of how schools and professionals in the community work together to enhance students' educational options. Done in cooperation with the Maryland State Department of Education, this is the 43rd year that this program has provided recognition, and in some cases credit, to piano students in their high school. Ann Matteson as the first chair, worked under the leadership of MSMTA president, Dr. Gail F. McDonald. Others who worked in the program at the origination were Mary Jane Schaeffer, Gary Dinn, Dr. Stewart Gordon, and Ruth Weinberg. They partnered with the legislature and Dr. James W. Lathan, the Director of the Maryland State Department of Education's Division of Instruction as well as Mr. James L. Tucker, Jr., Chief, Aesthetic and Gifted Programs. The examinations are unique in that they are open not only to MSMTA teachers' students, but also to any Maryland student in grades 9 through 12 who study piano privately. Letters and applications forms go out each fall to the principals and to music department heads of all public and private high schools in Maryland to tell them about the program. Students play a minimum of 10 minutes of memorized music from three different periods of music literature. They receive critiques from two judges, a certificate of achievement, and a report to be placed in their permanent record folder.

This year we had 96 students take the examination for recognition. We are pleased to see this valuable program continue for the benefit of the students.

The examinations were virtual this year. I would like to thank John Ralph who set up our online protocol and video submissions. We will remain virtual again next year. I would like to thank the following teachers who participated in the program:
