Our Conference began with Lorena Brougher and a presentation on ADHD. Lorena Brougher went through some common truths and misconceptions about the way our ADHD brains learn and think. She shed some light on the unique strengths of these often-misunderstood students and lastly, shared a short list of resources for the busy piano teacher. This was a very informative presentation on teaching students with ADHD that many of us see in our studios.





Our next presenter Andrew Rosenblum discussed Baroque Music at the Piano:

How Understanding Harpsichord Techniques Influences Interpretation of Baroque Music on the Piano.

This presentation outlined some of the core principles of phrasing and interpretation at the harpsichord and explored ways in which these practices can be successfully applied to the modern piano.
